DEED RESTRICTIONS

Woods Edge is a wonderful place to live. We should not lose sight of how fortunate we are to live in such a beautiful neighborhood. To maintain the beauty and preserve the value of our neighborhood, we have deed restrictions. They are contractual obligations assumed when you purchased your property.

The HOA Board has the task of making sure these restrictions are followed. When someone makes a complaint or a violation is observed, the HOA Board must investigate, and notify the property owner of the violation. The property owner is given 30 days to correct the violation. Most residents are neighborly and correct their violation without further action. The Board prefers to resolve these issues in an amicable way.

SECTION 3 DEED RESTRICTION VIOLATIONS

There are currently 2 active deed restriction violations that we are working to resolve. The violations are pending pre-litigation. As COVID-19 restrictions are lifted, our attorneys will be able to move forward to resolve these violations.

PREDATOR ALERT





Coyote and Bobcat sightings have occurred in and around Woods Edge. As their natural habitat shrinks, they are forced to enter developed areas in search of food. Owls and Hawks also see small pets as a food source.

Please be aware and keep your pets safe, especially at night.

FENCES

If the fence on your property is in need of attention, replace, repair, or remove it.



DRIVEWAY CULVERTS

Make sure your culverts are clear. Dirt and debris impedes the flow of drainage water.

TREE BRANCHES OVER THE STREET



Most of the trees in Woods Edge are mature in size. Some were planted close to the street and have branches that go over the street. Some of these branches are scraping residents' RV's, and trailers as they drive under them.

If you have trees planted near the street, please take a look and see if some of the lower branches that go over the street, need to be trimmed. Branches should be trimmed to a minimum height of 14 feet above the road. The height of larger RVs run between 13' - 13'-6". If you trim your branches a little higher, you won't have to trim so often.

Your neighbors will appreciate it.

WATER WELL TESTING



Periodically we should all test our drinking water. Ft. Bend County Environmental Services collects and transports water samples to the City of Houston every Wednesday morning for testing. Water sample bottles and sample forms can be obtained from FBC Environmental Services on Hwy 90 in Rosenberg. The fee for drinking water testing is \$16.50 per bottle. Checks must be made payable to the City of Houston (no cash accepted). The procedure is outlined below:

Sample Collection Procedure

- Select an outside cold water faucet, closest to your well
- Remove any screen or attachment to the faucet
- Clean the faucet head with isopropyl alcohol or bleach solution and/or flame with a handheld torch.
- Run the water 10 minutes to clear the line.
- Adjust the flow to a slow, steady stream.
- Remove the shrink band from the bottle (do not use the bottle if the shrink band is missing
- Remove the lid of the bottle. Do not touch the inside of the lid or the bottle. Do not rinse out the bottle.
- Fill the bottle ABOVE the 100ml line to at least the shoulder of the bottle, leaving adequate space for mixing. **Do not overfill the bottle.**
- Under filled and overfilled bottles will not be analyzed
- Replace the lid tightly
- Place the sample in a cooler with ice packs and transport to the lab within 28 hours of collection.
- **Do not freeze the sample.** Frozen samples will not be analyzed.
- Deliver the sample to Fort Bend County Environmental Services within 28 hours of collection
- Water samples should be held and transported to the FBC Environmental Services in a cooler with a frozen ice pack.
- Do not allow the completed sample form to get wet during transport of the sample.

If you cannot deliver the sample on the day of collection, store it in the refrigerator overnight and transport it on ice within 28 hours of collection.



A LOOK BACK – WOODS EDGE HISTORY

Jim Michalek, a long time resident of Section 1, provided a glimpse of the past in Woods Edge:

My sojourn in Woods Edge is by no means the earliest. Our search for "that place in the country" began around 1986-87. Mary and I discovered Woods Edge one weekend and drove through Sections One and Two at least 20 times over many weekends. That had the added advantage of an equal number of stops at the Swinging Door. Section Three had been platted but not yet for sale.

There was no blacktop here in Woods Edge back then. Everything was rock gravel and everything was like driving a horse buckboard over country roads—not pretty and damn sure not comfortable. Potholes were of the large variety, so each visit through was SLOOW!

Our existing lots at Mimosa and Cypress Green (Section 1) were a wooded swamp, so we opted originally for a lot in Section 3, not yet up for sale by the developer. But Section 1 kept beckoning, and I had a vision, so it was here that we called it "home" in February,1990. My "across the street" neighbor in the single story house next to the big main drain-way that crosses Cypress Green was Henry Gorka, who has since died. Henry and his son, Pete, did the original road grading and drain ditch slopes for the developer. It all drained well in 1990. It has gone downhill, no pun intended, since then.

Back then, what is now the Red Potato Market Gift Shop, at FM 359 and Holmes Rd, was called Schultz's Grocery Store. Dating, I believe, from the 1920's, it had become a place to pick up fruit, veggies, milk, and basic necessities. They still had an operating gasoline pump in front. Just the original country version of a modern day 7-11, or similar.

Civilization had not yet trampled over us in the early '90's. Mason Road did not exist in its present form and there were no commercial structures North of where CVS stands now. The only restaurants out here were the Swinging Door, Friend's Café (where Quilter's Cottage is now on FM-359), and Hill's Diner across from that. Hill's Diner was in a converted mobile home type structure, and served great diner food. Ronnie Hill, the owner, could talk of nothing more than building his dream right behind the existing diner, the soon to be Hill's Bar and Restaurant, with the emphasis on Bar because the restaurant portion never got to the level of his original diner food. Unfortunately they were open a relatively short while before Ronnie died, I think from a heart attack, but not sure. That space is now occupied by Richmond Rustic Furniture on FM 359.

The area has come a long way since then, but some might argue for a slower, less populated area. But progress can't be stopped and we here in Woods Edge have the solace of being able to make the turn down that majestic line of old Live Oaks and pull an imaginary curtain closed behind us, for at least a while.
